Trash Rules

1. Trash pickup will be Thursday of each week; (Please place your container(s) out the evening before. Your container MUST be out no later than 5 a.m. Thursday morning.)
2. The bill is due on the 10th of every month. Billing is done on the 20th of every month. (If you become delinquent you will be sent a letter that has further instructions.)
3. Only blue Waste Connection containers should be used.
4. No personal containers will be emptied.
5. Trash outside container must be bagged and only 2 bags maximum will be picked up.
6. Please bag all your trash for easier pick up and disposal.
7. Carts should be placed on level ground as close to the street as possible and the opening of the lid facing the street.
8. Trash payments can be mailed in by check or money order, dropped off in person via check, money order, cash, or credit card- with a 3% processing fee. Over the phone with a credit card- with a 3% processing fee, or online at www.payjctx.com (have your account number handy.)
9. Heavy trash will be every other Saturday.
10. Heavy Haul items can only be placed next to the street the week prior to pick up.
11. Heavy Haul materials must be contained as much as possible and should be able to **fit into the bed of a truck.** (ex. bagged, stacked, bundled).
12. When doing remodeling or debris cleaning consider renting Roll-off containers through Waste Connections (1-979-864-4600 for more details).

Items that will not be picked up include the following:

*Tree or shrub branches exceeding 3 in. diameter shall not be considered "Yard Waste". Leaves, grass clippings, shrub and tree pruning must be tied in a bundle not exceeding 2 ft. in girth or 4ft. in length and no more than 2 yards in total.

*Asbestos

*Ashes, hot or cold

*Automobile batteries

*Compact fluorescent bulbs & tubes (CFL)

*Electronic waste (computers, TV, and more)

* Tires

* Motor oil

*Construction or demolition debris (including but not limited to: dry wall, roofing, dirt, concrete, rocks, etc.)

*Ammunition or anything radioactive, volatile, corrosive, highly flammable, explosive.

* Household hazardous waste

* Liquid waste like paint

* Medical waste or Pharmaceuticals

* Sharps (needles or syringes)

* Un-bagged packing pellets or sawdust

*Anything biohazardous, biomedical, infectious, toxic, or hazardous.

*Dead animals
